

# **COVID-19 UPDATE June 26, 2020**

Okanogan County Public Health is reporting 3 new cases since yesterday (June 25, 2020). Two new cases are from Oroville and one new case is from Tonasket.

#### **Okanogan County is Currently in Phase 2**

As a reminder, Okanogan County is still in Phase 2. Today marks the day that Okanogan County is technically eligible to apply for Phase 3 (each county must spend a minimum of 3 weeks in each Phase), however we are not currently meeting the target for the key metrics. These metrics are being monitoring closely by public health and we will apply for Phase 3 once our metrics improve.

#### **Statewide Face Covering Order Goes Into Effect Today**

Starting today, June 26, 2020, facial coverings are required in public places, including indoors and in outdoor areas where 6 ft. physical distancing cannot be maintained. A face covering does not need to be a manufactured mask – it can be cloth mask, a scarf, or bandana that covers your nose and mouth.
