## Safe Start Washington: A Phased Approach to Recovery

While <u>Stay Home, Stay Healthy</u> is being extended to the end of May, the governor announced his Safe Start plan which amends some components of the original order and allows for a phased re-opening of Washington's economy.

Phase 1, which begins tomorrow Tuesday May 5<sup>th</sup> allows for:

- Hunting, fishing, golfing, boating, hiking
- Drive-in spiritual service with one household per vehicle
- Essential travel and limited non-essential travel for Phase 1 permissible activities
- Essential businesses
- Existing construction that meets agreed upon criteria
- Landscaping
- Auto/RV/Boat/ORV sales
- Retail (curb-side pick-up orders only)
- Car washes
- Pet walkers

Small counties with a population less than 75,000 that have not identified a resident with COVID-19 for the past three weeks are able to apply for a variance to move to Phase 2 before the rest of the state. Okanogan County received the most recent positive test result on April 26, 2020.
