INCIDENT SUMMARY

General Situation: We are collaboratively working to address PPE shortages, enhance health care capabilities and educate the public on non-pharmaceutical interventions (NPI's) to mitigate effects of the COVID-19 pandemic on all residents of Okanogan County.

SIGNIFICANT EVENTS FOR REPORTING PERIOD

General / Community:

- 4/23 First COVID-19 death in Okanogan County
- Ongoing Health care facilities are reporting on traveling staff, supply needs and capacities.
- All health care facilities are locked down (one entrance in/out).
- DOE requests people do not burn due to COVID; however no DOE burn ban is in effect.
- Bureau of Reclamation (Okanogan Irrigation District) still on Level 1 response for a small hole on the top of Salmon Lake Dam in Conconully. (No threat at this time.) Bureau team conduct a seepage analysis using a water-safe red dye, 4/23. A mix of the dye and water will be poured into the hole, which will help to determine the path the water is taking and how quickly the water is flowing. Together, this information will help inform a resolution to the issue at the dam. Should have result 4/24.
- Lael Duncan with Community Action is completing a long term forecast of estimated food needs and supplies for area food banks.
- 4/17 DNR lifted ban on Permit burns, Rule burns, not to exceed 10 feet in diameter, are allowed.
- 4/15 Received Resolution 49-2020 by Okanogan County Board of Commissioners and Okanogan County Health Officer closing overnight transient accommodations and hospitality lodging until further notice.
- Calls are being received regarding confusion over burn ban locations and rules.
- 4/17 L&I Handouts "COVID Prevention for Ag & Related Industries", "COVID Food Processing-Warehouse Fact Sheet" and EM "Safe Shopping Tips" were e-mailed in English and Spanish to area fruit warehouses, growers, warehouse fieldmen, ag chemical distributors, ag company fieldmen, the Okanogan County Pest Control Board and Okanogan County Horticultural Association members.
- We are contacting grocery and retail stores to provide them with health safety guidelines and posters.
- Agricultural warehouses who received COVID-19 safety information from us on 4/17 are forwarding the information to employees, growers and field men.
- 4/23 Schools pushed notice out asking only to have one person pick up lunches from busses, per EOC request.

- 4/22 200 test swabs were transported from Chelan County to Public Health in Okanogan by Chelan County Sheriff's Office and Okanogan County Sheriff's Office personnel.
- Resolution <u>51-2020</u> amending overnight transient accommodations (OTA's) from "closed" to "restricted" was posted to Public Health and Emergency Management websites and social media.
- 4/22 Zac Claussen, Public Works Director for the Town of Conconully, picked up 10 Super-Sacks for flood control to assist Bureau of Reclamation staff coming to inspect Salmon Lake Dam tomorrow.

Critical Needs - Alternate Care Facility:

- Two potential alternate care facilities (ACF) are under consideration.
- 4/10 Okanogan Public Health, Emergency Management, Washington State DOH and US Army Corps of Engineers conducted a preliminary inspection of the Fair Grounds Agriplex as a potential isolation/quarantine facility.
- Building plans for the Annex at the Fair Grounds have been located and scanned. Josh Thomson of Public Works is attempting to locate plans for the Agriplex building. ACE is requesting plans.
- A hospital patient placement and transfer plan has been finalized.
- Contacted local hotels/motels about willingness to dedicate room(s) to isolation and/or quarantine
- Contacted Public Health and Community Action about room cleaning, decontamination and provisions for people in quarantine or isolation.
- 4/231600 Conference Call with Community Action, EM, Public Health re: alternate care facility considerations
- Ordered 8 hospital beds from State EOC for ACF
- Discussed staffing with State EOC

Critical Needs - Supplies & PPE:

- Public Health reports test kits are still urgently needed.
- PPE requests have been filled for gloves and masks. There is still a shortage on isolation and surgical gowns, individual hand sanitizer bottles and disinfectant wipes. Health care clinics and hospitals are beginning to run low on thermometer disposable ear guards.
- All hospitals, clinics, long-term care facilities, in-home care providers and EMS have been contacted regarding PPE's. Minimum needs were met this week for masks and gloves.
- 4/21 PPE's have been distributed to first responders, clinics, hospitals and long-term care facilities.
- 4/23 Received 215 donated face shields from Steel Rule Concepts, Kent WA


